TWO THREE-DAY INTENSIVE MODULES VIRTUAL TRAINING

We are pleased to announce a unique opportunity to further your Sandplay Therapy training through virtual learning – **available only for the duration of 2020**. Due to the pandemic, the International Society for Sandplay Therapy has approved credit for **all virtual training hours** earned during 2020 (exceeding the current maximum allowable 20 hours).

While virtual learning has its challenges, there are also advantages: no need to travel nor find accommodations, the opportunity to work from the comfort of your personal work-space, and the chance to build your Sandplay skills safely during the current pandemic.

We hope that you will attend both Modules 1 and 2, for a total of 38 hours of ISST-approved training. While registration in Module 2 is not required for registration in Module 1, we hope you will see the value in this unprecedented opportunity and register for both.

The remainder of the training hours for achievement of the 100-hour requirement will be offered in 2021, with structure and timing to be determined.

Olga and Maria will share the teaching most suited to the time zone of their locations: Olga will facilitate the morning program and Maria the afternoon program.

All handouts and training materials are provided virtually.

The program will use the Zoom meeting platform.

Module 1 Virtual Training (18 hours)

November 15,16,17 – Sunday through Tuesday: 9-12pm and 2-5pm
6 hours per day with breaks for reflection

Module 2 Virtual Training (20 hours)

December 6,7,8 – Sunday through Tuesday: 9-12pm and 2-5pm
6 hours per day with breaks for reflection
Plus 2 hours for completing a between-module assignment

Prerequisites

Prerequisites for Module 1:

1. Minimum 12 hours in-person or online training
** If you attended a 2020 8-hour virtual workshop, you will attend a 4-hour virtual workshop with Maria in late October or early November – date TBA
2. Submission of CAST Level I Training Application no later than October 25 (to Maria and Olga)

Prerequisites for Module 2:

1. Completion of Module 1 Virtual Training (some exceptions allowed)
2. Completion of the between-module assignment
3. Submission of CAST Level II Training Application and narrative no later than November 22 (to Maria and Olga, and the CAST Registrar and Teaching Member Barbara Dalziel)
4. Acceptance to Level II requires membership in CAST – due December 1, 2020, \$110 payable online and valid through December 31, 2021

She is the recipient of a federal grant for her doctorate research at Concordia University with its focus on Sandplay Therapy. Since 2003, Olga worked in mental health and community organizations, and in private practice as a psychotherapist, Sandplay Therapist, and Art Therapist. She has published, presented at various national and international conferences. Olga teaches Sandplay Therapy and also provides supervision and Sandplay process to trainees in Canada and abroad.

TRAINING PROGRAM

All training seminars have three components: experiential, theoretical, and clinical. Experiential activities are used to teach the theory and principles of Kalfjian sandplay, which are then elaborated in lectures and discussion. Clinical examples from case material, used with permission, illustrate sandplay dynamics in client process and within the therapeutic relationship.

Illustrative sandpictures are used to develop "seeing" skills that include bodily responses, evocation of memories, emotions, prior knowledge, and intuitive sense-making dynamics; and, subsequently, analysis and interpretation of pictures based on rational guidelines, amplification of symbolic material, and meaning for the client. This learning is integrated with an understanding of issues in the clinical practice of sandplay, emphasizing the central role of the therapist.

Throughout the training participants will write about their experience and develop awareness of their dynamic process with sandplay and their professionalism as a sandplay therapist. The program includes, but is not limited to:

• History and development of sandplay

Major influences on Kalfff; elements of sandplay in traditions of healing; therapist as a non-intrusive witness; silence/non-silence; the hands as knowers; observation strategies; cultural considerations.

• Developmental psychology and its relation to sandplay

Emphasis on attachment dynamics, affect regulation and development of the self; developing a capacity for free-flowing play; psychological development as expressed through sandplay.

• First sandpictures

Chaos and order; containment; ordering elements; movement and energy patterns; polarities in the tray; centering; looking for themes; what first pictures can tell us about the process.

• Jungian psychology and sandplay

Relevant terms and dynamics; vertical and horizontal dimensions; inner and outer worlds; relational aspects; relationship of sandplay to other modalities for expression of unconscious material.

• Symbols and symbolic process



The nature and role of archetypes in deep psychological work; personal and cultural associations to symbols.

• The Mother archetype / the feminine and sandplay

Models of Jung, Neumann, and others; characteristics, imagery, and cultural examples.

• The Father archetype / the masculine and sandplay

Models for understanding; personal and archetypal symbolism; cultural influences and attitudes.

• Masculine and feminine

Relationship to Mother and Father archetypes; models of development; neuroscience, attachment and sandplay.

• The Child archetype

Exploration of imagery; different child archetypes: inner child; abandoned child; divine child.

• The Self in sandplay, myth and fairytales

Self as organizing principle of the psyche; manifestations in sandplay, myths, and fairytales.
